Three themes are notable in this edition of the *InSight: Rivier Academic Journal*: 1) a collection of 33 photographs that have been selected by jurors (*Cliff Davis, Elissa Lautenschlager*, and *Dr. Herman Tavani*) from 176 entries submitted by students, staff, faculty, and community members for participating in the First Rivier Community Photo Contest organized by the Journal Editorial Board and dedicated to the 75th Anniversary of Rivier College; 2) outstanding discussions on the *Veracity of Memory* (*Dr. Elizabethada A. Wright, Dr. Jerome Rekart*, and *Dr. Ivor Pattison*) during the Interdisciplinary Colloquium organized by *Prof. Sheli Petersen* and *Dr. Martin Menke*; and 3) remarkable poems written by *Dr. Elizabethada A. Wright* and *Dr. Robert T. McLaughlin*, as well as by gifted young poets: *Jeff Wyman, Jessica (Jaimee) Bellissimo, Denise Petz*, and *Margaret Shaw*.

In the Research & Scholarship section, readers can discover studies of Rivier students on the Concept of a Crusade (by Thomas Jackson), Constitutional Challenges in the Twenty-First Century (by Joseph Thompson), The Truth about Poverty and Its Effect on Our Nation's Youth (by Katelyn Tocci), and a review of the Remote Authentication Dial-In User Service (by Computer Science students, Daniel Szilagyi, Arti Sood and Tej Singh).

The *Chronicle* section covers various remarkable events in Rivier campus life, such as the Rivier's 74th Commencement, the Holly Mass and Academic Convocation, the Graduate Hooding Ceremony, the Nursing Pinning Ceremony, Biology Seminar Series, Senior Honors Thesis Presentations, and others. Here the readers can find information about Rivier's Student Achievement Awards, scholarships, faculty profiles and information about articles, which have been recently published by faculty, students, staff, and alumni in other publications.

This ninth issue of the *InSight: Rivier Academic Journal* could not have been published without the active support of many members of the college community to whom I am most grateful.
