On June 30, Vice President for Academic Outreach **Dr. Joseph Allard** and Executive Director of the Rivier Institute for Senior Education **Dr. Rose Arthur** retired from Rivier College.



During his 26 years at Rivier, Dr. Allard (*left*) taught in the Business Administration Department, where he also served as department chair. He was Dean of the Undergraduate Evening School and Assistant Vice President for Academic Affairs before he was appointed Vice President for Academic Outreach. At a gathering to wish Dr. Allard well, President William Farrell presented him with a Rivier College chair in recognition of his dedicated service to the College. He will also be honored with a brick in the walkway to the new entrance to the Muldoon Fitness Center when construction is completed this fall.

Dr. Arthur began at Rivier in 1988 as Dean of the Undergraduate Evening School. In 1996, she established RISE, another way to showcase her appreciation for lifelong education. The program has grown from 60 members to nearly 400. In 2006, at age 75, Dr. Arthur was named New Hampshire's Older Worker of the Year by Experience Works, a national organization dedicated to meeting the training and employment needs of the mature workforce.

Colleagues and members of RISE established the Dr. Rose Arthur Scholarship in her honor, which will be awarded to undergraduate evening students attending Rivier who have demonstrated a commitment to the greater Nashua community through volunteer work or public service. ■
