**R**ivier College's two newest members of the Board of Trustees, **Sister Claire Guerin, p.m.** and **Sister Jacqueline Lambert, p.m.**, are both alumnae and Sisters of the Presentation of Mary, the religious community that founded and has staffed the College for the last 78 years.

Sister Claire is presently the Local Superior of the Ste. Claire d'Assise Community at the Sisters' residence in Methuen, Mass. and its Director of Group Adult Foster Care. Sister Claire has more than 25 years combined teaching and administrative experience at the elementary, junior, and high school levels. In addition, she has served in leadership roles within her religious community. Sister Claire earned her bachelor's degree in education from Rivier College in 1971 and a master's degree in theology from St. Michael's College in Winooski, Vt. in 1981.

Sister Jacqueline served a combined 20 years as an elementary and early childhood teacher and 15 years as the Early Childhood Program Director at Presentation of Mary Preschool in Methuen, Mass. Throughout her professional career, she ministered to those less fortunate in her longtime service to Lazarus House Ministries in Lawrence, Mass., which offers transitional housing and support services to heads of household and individuals in need. In addition, Sister Jacqueline has served her religious community in various leadership positions. She graduated from Rivier College with a bachelor's degree in education in 1981. ■
