

RIVIER COLLEGE TO HOST NATIVE AMERICAN SPEAKER ON NOVEMBER 1, 2011

The Rivier College community will have an opportunity to hear about Native American culture from an individual whose ancestors lived in the local area.

On Nov. 1, 2011, **Paul Pouliot**, the Chief Speaker for the Cowasuck Band of the Pennacook and Abenaki People, will share myths and misconceptions of Native Americans held by individuals today and offer a contemporary analysis of being a descendant of these people. The event will be held from 2:30-3:30 p.m. in the Dion Center Reception Room.

“We are looking forward to hearing the insight and experience that Paul will bring as a member of a Native American ethnic group with ties to our region,” said Director of Multicultural Affairs Sharron Rowlett-Moore.

The Pennacook were an Algonquin-speaking people native to the Merrimack Valley region of New Hampshire and Massachusetts, and parts of southern Maine. ■
