

The artist researched, wrote, and drew the pictures for Fast Enough: Bessie Stringfield's First Ride, the award-winning graphic novel series Strange Fruit: Uncelebrated Narratives from Black History, and Bass Reeves: Tales of The Talented Tenth. Published in January 2020, his latest work is a memoir. Titled FIGHTS: One Boy's Triumph Over Violence, the novel chronicles how children deal with abuse and trauma.

Gill has worked for diverse clients including NBC, the Boston Globe, and HuffPost. A sought-after speaker for comic arts conventions and college campuses across the United States, in 2016 he was honored with a Distinguished Alumni Award from Boston University where he received his MFA degree. Former Chair of the Comic Arts and Foundations programs at the New Hampshire Institute of Art, he was recently appointed Associate Professor of Illustration at Massachusetts College of Art and Design.
