

MEMBERS OF RIVIER COMMUNITY NAMED TO LIST OF TOP NASHUA BUSINESS LEADERS

(Rivier Today, Spring 2013)

Nine individuals connected to Rivier University were recently named to *The Telegraph's* list of Nashua's top 50 business leaders who have impacted Nashua over the last 50 years, and the next 20 leaders on the rise, as part of its 'Nashua 50' series.

Sister Jeanne Perreault, pm, Rivier president from 1980 to 1997 and a member of the Rivier University Board of Trustees, was recognized as one of the 'Nashua 50' for increasing Rivier's enrollment, building new health and education centers and expanding the campus size by 50 percent. She was noted for transitioning Rivier to a co-educational institution in 1991.

Named to the list of the 20 business leaders who will impact Nashua's future were **Sister Paula Marie Buley, IHM**, President; **Karen Cooper**, Rivier's executive director of development and marketing; **Rob Prunier**, executive vice president and principal owner of Harvey Construction Corp. and member of the Board of Trustees; and **Brad Kreick**, executive vice president at Apria Healthcare, Inc., and also a Rivier Trustee.

John Kreick, former president of Sanders Associates; **John Stabile** of The Stabile Companies; and the late **William Elias Conway**, former president and CEO of Nashua Corp.—all former Rivier board members—were also recognized among the top '50.' The family of **Samuel Tamposi, Jr.**, a current Board of Trustees member, was listed in the Nashua 50 Families for their contributions to local real estate development. ■
